A Norwegian invention



Thor Bjørklund (born 1889, died 1975) was a Norwegian carpenter and is best known as the inventor of the cheese razor.

He was annoyed that he did not get as thin slices as he wished when he cut the cheese with a knife, and that the cheese was destroyed by it. That is why he started at Lillehammer to experiment with a carpenter, hoping to make something similar in a format that fit in the kitchen. He succeeded. In the beginning he made cheese slicer for his acquaintance circle, and on February 27, 1925, he was granted a patent on the tool that is currently found in most households in the Nordic countries. Very few changes have been made to the cheese slicer throughout its lifetime.



The Norwegian Royalty

Harald V (born 21 February 1937) is King of Norway, having ascended the throne upon the death of his father King Olav V on 17 January 1991.

Harald was the third child and only son of King Olav V and Princess Märtha of Sweden. He was second in the line of succession at the time of his birth, behind his father. In 1940, as a result of the German occupation during World War II, the royal family went into exile. Harald spent part of his childhood in Sweden and the United States. He returned to Norway in 1945, and subsequently studied for periods at the University of Oslo, the Norwegian Military Academy and Balliol College, Oxford.

In 1957, following the death of his grandfather, Haakon VII, Harald became crown prince. A keen sportsman, he represented Norway in sailing at the 1964, 1968, and 1972 Olympic Games, and later became patron of World Sailing.

Harald married Sonja Haraldsen (born July 4, 1937) in 1968, their relationship having initially being controversial due to her status as a commoner. She was the daughter of Karl August Haraldsen, a clothing merchant. The couple have two children, Märtha Louise and Haakon. Harald succeeded his father as king in 1991, with Haakon becoming his heir apparent.

The Norwegian royal family belongs to the House of Glücksburg, shortened from House of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburg-Glücksborg, a Dano-German branch the House of Oldenburg. King Harald's father and grandfather was born in Denmark. They carried the title Prince of Denmark. The line was founded by the Duke Philip (1584-1663). The line was named after Glücksburg Castle in Schleswig-Holstein.

Law of Jante

The Law of Jante is a code of conduct known in Nordic countries that portrays not conforming, doing things out of the ordinary, or being overtly personally ambitious as unworthy and inappropriate. The attitudes were first formulated in the form of the ten rules of Jante Law by the Dano-Norwegian author Aksel Sandemose in his satirical novel A Fugitive Crosses His Tracks (En flyktning krysser sitt spor, 1933), but the actual attitudes themselves are older. Sandemose portrays the fictional small Danish town Jante, which he modelled upon his native town Nykøbing Mors in the 1930s, where nobody was anonymous, which was typical of all small towns and communities.
