Solskinn Lodge Hosts Zone 6 Member Seminar







Saturday, February 23 at Hope Lutheran Church 43 members of 5 different Zone 6, District Six, Sons of Norway Lodges and others interested in Sons of Norway gathered to learn about all the resources Sons of Norway and District Six have for their members. The five lodges included: Solskinn, Sundfjord, Soldalen, Vahall and Vinland. District Six President, Luella Grangaard, District Six Secretary, Nancy Madson and Zone 6 Director Ronna Clymens lead the seminar. There was a review of Sons of Norway, the three legged stool "Fraternal, Financial and Foundation". James Donavan who is the Financial Benefits Counselor (FBC) for most of Zone 6, spoke on financial products and the care and concern Sons of Norway has for its members. Camp Norge, Camp Trollfjell as well as scholarship opportunities were discussed.

The group took a break midway and enjoyed a Frokost (breakfast) with a large variety of foods. During the breakfast, Chris Peoples and David Ritland played traditional Norwegian music along with a fun Lefse song. There were also drawings and practicing taking photos for submission to the Viking Magazine. What a great learning opportunity.





Oslo Ranked 2nd Healthiest City in the World Oslo was recently named the world's second healthiest city. Using key metrics like life expectancy at birth and work-life balance, the online home rental company, Spotahome, created a healthy index to rank 89 global cities. Of the global cities analyzed, Oslo and Helsinki were the only two Scandinavian countries to make the top 10. While it's no secret that Norway continues to top lists for work-life balance and happiness, Oslo also scored particularly high in green space, life expectancy and air/water quality. Since the city has already unveiled plans to go green by 2025, it's easy to see

why it ranked so high. The initiative includes making the city center car-free, and adding more pedestrian and bike friendly areas. Additionally, the life expectancy in Norway is 84 years for women and 81 years for men, which is among the highest in the world. In total, Oslo scored an average of 6.61 points out of 10. Reenactments Provide Glimpse into the Viking Age—Viking re-

enactment groups are becoming more prevalent than ever, with groups popping up in the United Kingdom, mainland Europe and Northern America. Related Facebook groups may be a reason for the rise in awareness and popularity, with several groups each boasting thousands of members. Reenactment groups strive for authenticity in their activities, be it scenes from everyday life (baking, forging, gardening, carving) or participating in re-created battles. Many members of these groups study Viking life and culture in detail, from exploring ancient Viking sites, studying Norse sagas or scrutinizing artifacts and old trade routes. There are active online marketplaces for buying, selling and trading Viking replicated clothing, accessories and equipment. On websites such as Etsy one can source jewelry, tunics, headwear, footwear, tankards, shields, props and more. To get a real flavor for Viking reenactment, check out a recent issue of National Geographic, "The Vikings, Lords of Sea and Sword." Re-enactors were used in photographs to illustrate in detail various aspects of Viking life.

The Vikings in Ireland – Happy St. Patrick's Day

Although the territories the Vikings took were not very large and thus did not have a huge geographical impact on Ireland, the Vikings did end up significantly influencing Ireland in a political, economic, and cultural way. The Irish took over some Norse cues regarding warfare, especially regarding weapons and tactics, but it was the Viking *longphorts* grown into towns with commercial characters that gave Ireland, formerly lacking proper towns, a major, lasting boost. Furthermore, the extended Viking ties with the rest of the British Isles and continental Europe enlarged the Irish trading scene in general.
